

Communion in the Ending Days

A. Holy Communion

1. Creativity

Jesus left His divinity in Heaven. He did not minister as God but as son of man (85 times) and as Son of God (5 times).

He was Son of God for two reasons. His human ancestry traces back to Adam who was a son of God. He was also the Word made flesh by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, Jesus made the Communion bread into His body and the wine into His blood by the power of Gen 1:26, 1:28.

Only a god can do that; and that is what Ps 82:6 says.

2. Restoration

By His one sacrifice of His body and Blood, he restored mankind back to what God had created them to be. He undid what Adam lost and gave us much more by the Blood Covenant of the New Testament.

B. The Body

1. His Body fulfilled all the OT covenants.

What was the purposes of all those covenants?

Restoration to who and what Adam was.

The last Adam came to undo what satan and Adam had done.

If Adam and his descendants had not sinned, they would have been:

Free of sin, free of all spots, wrinkles and blemishes.

Full of the Glory of God, glowing.

Have been gods over the earth.

2. His Body has restored us to that right of being the Glorious Church:

A church that can sin but chooses not to do so.

A church that can die but is holding fast to their Crown (Rev 3:11).

C. The Blood

1. His Blood initiated a blood Covenant.

We accept that covenant by drinking His Blood and presenting our bodies as living sacrifices.

Obedience is better than sacrifice, so our bodies are not meant to die; they are meant to be obedient. We love Him when we keep His commandments.

We die to self, to sin, to carnality. We lose our lives in Christ Jesus to live for Him so we can find our lives.

2. His Blood made us new creations.

We were crucified with Christ but we live, but not us, Christ lives in us and the life we now live, we live by His faith; the faith of God, which turned bread into His Body and wine into His Blood.



Prayers in the Ending Days

1. Mind of Christ

- a. In the Name of Jesus, I have the Mind of Christ.
- b. In the Name of Jesus, I let into my mind only that which belongs in the Mind of Christ.

2. Words and Meditations

a. In the Name of Jesus, the Holy Spirit gives me the words of my mouth and the thoughts, meditations, imaginations, dreams, hope, goals. plans, and ambitions of my heart, soul and mind.

3. Say and do

a. In the Name of Jesus, I think, say and do only what my Heavenly Father thinks, says and does.

4. Unity with the Holy Spirit

- a. In the Name of Jesus, I am one with the Holy Spirit for He is in me and I am in Him.
- b. In the Name of Jesus, I am filled with the Holy Spirit without measure.
- c. In the Name of Jesus, I am led by the Holy Spirit at all times and in everything that I think, say and do.

5. Perfectionism

- a. I have been perfected by Jesus Christ.
- b. I am complete in Christ Jesus.
- c. In the Name of Jesus, I am filled with the fulness of God.

6. Our Goal

- a. In the Name of Jesus, I am conformed to the image of Jesus Christ.
- b. In the Name of Jesus, I have overcome all things.
- c. In the Name of Jesus, I am a pillar in the temple of God and the Lamb.
